

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
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BMW CCA - NY Chapter Presents "Here Comes Summer" Road Rally (Fun/Gimmick Style) Sunday May 19th, 2002



Does it drive like a BMW?

Well not exactly! "First Impressions in the real world"

Introducing a new car from the people that gave new meaning to the letter

Μ.

A strange concept indeed. A car company developing a new automobile under the precept that bigger isn't necessarily better. It's a refreshing idea whose time has come. History and evolution should remind us of what happened to the dinosaur!



Every so often, there arrives something that stands out as being somewhat special and that everyone desires to have; whether it's that new electronic gizmo, the latest in microwave technology or in this case an automobile. The new Mini Cooper.

As you all well know by now, BMW took hold of that very English of institutions, the mini, and with a very large infusion of Deutsche mark's breathed new life into a 40-year-old automo-





tive design. It being marketed as a small, economical and nimble automobile that's a hoot to drive. Throw in affordability and a large dose of cuteness and you have a recipe for lots to smile about.

It's a simple matter of the whole being greater than the sum of its parts. It may not have the biggest engine or the biggest brakes, but package all the pieces into a car that just about fits into a dumpster and you have the makings of something rather special. Then, bolt on a supercharger, 6-speed gearbox, 16" wheels and an upgraded suspension and now we're talking about a serious contribution to the automotive world – the Mini Cooper S.

I took delivery of mine on March 29th. Broke it in over the next week just in time for my first autocross event of the year on April 7th at the Metro NY Porsche event at Tobay Beach. This was my first event of the year and I managed to somehow forget everything I learned the previous season. If my Evolution school driving instructors had seen my performance they would have disavowed the fact that they had ever met me. How did it handle you ask? I just have one thing to say. If I had run in the Boxster class that day, my best time would have placed me in fifth out of the ten cars running. If only I had gotten my brain in gear that day and been running on

my Kumho's!

What do I personally like about the Cooper S? First of all, it's a refreshing design that works. It can seat four adults, it's got a trunk and can fit in places that most other vehicles can't. And that includes that prized parking spot in the city that only a motorcyclist would consider or that gap in traffic, opening up only momentarily just long enough for it to sneak through. It's definitely a kick to drive and also meets with my definition of the word practical.

My dislikes? Only one, in that I'm quite spoiled when it comes to tires. The treadwear rating of the tires I'm used to using is typically in the low 100"s. The Dunlop "Sport" 5000's equipped on the Cooper S are an M&S rated all season run-flat tire with a treadwear rating of 280. The Autocross event quickly discovered the shortcomings of this tire selection. Talk about having no traction in first or second gear.

On my way back home the other night, I found myself driving amongst a sea of SUV's loafing along at a snails pace. It was a Jurassic park moment. While the other vehicles casually grazed along the parkway, I pondered the future of the internal combustion engine and the automobile as we know it. If this mini concept could only catch on, then, just maybe, mankind may have a chance after all.

We were introduced to the new 7 Series. BMW's latest entry in the ultraluxury class. Its design, as I am sure you all know by now is unique. It received mixed re-

views from those present. It features computer controlled everything!! Having driven this beast, a week earlier, I can tell you, it is a BMW, great handling and horsepower on tap. The way it handles belies its size. It's certainly not a 3 Series, but I could be forced to "suffer" with one if I had to.

BMW unveiled its CS1 concept car. Tom Solkowsky, M Brand Manager, explained that its design was based on their conception of what a 2002 would be like, if it were still in production.

What a shame, this car is not going into production. Wouldn't it have been great if it were introduced this year as the 'New' 2002.

We had our annual Q&A session with Rich Brekus BMW NA's Production Manager. It was our golden opportunity to try to pry the lid of secrecy open. The traditional ground rules prevailed. We could ask any question we wanted to. BMW 'brass' would only answer the questions they wanted to, but a well-phrased question would offer us a hint. Some of the future plans that



were revealed to our group were, a new 6 Series will be forthcoming, as well as a redesigned 5 Series. A 1 Series is coming in



the future. The Z3 Roadster will be replaced with a new version, come this fall. Z3 coupes are not to be forthcoming. We were told that the model year 2003 would be bringing a windfall of new and exciting BMW cars. The structured presentation broke up at about 10AM. At this point we could go one on one with the BMW folk or take this opportunity to run thru the Javits Center. Its great to have full access to the show before the doors opened to the public. This was a great morning to be a BMW fanatic. This is just one way that BMW NA expresses their thanks to the CCA members for their support. Next year if you are fortunate to receive a ticket for this event, please come to the breakfast and share your enthusiasm for the marque with your fellow members.



You're Racing Your Car on a Lake Again THIS Winter?? Are You Sure There's Enough Ice Up There?

I've been a member of the Boston Chapter of the BMW CCA since the late 80s. When I moved back to New York and joined the New York Chapter in the early 90s, I started participating in the Boston Chapter's Ice Racing events on Newfound Lake, New Hampshire. Why did I wait until I moved 5 hours away to do this? At first, the concept of putting one's car on a frozen lake invoked memories of Bugs & Daffy or Tom & Jerry where anyone who fell through the ice - and somebody ALWAYS fell through the ice - would be pulled out of the water frozen inside a big ice cube. Of course, they were still alive, but their teeth were chattering, they had turned blue, and they had to be left in front of the fireplace to thaw. Or I thought of that movie "The Four Seasons" where the uptight dentist (Jack Weston) screamed, "My Mercedes!!!" as he watched in horror while his car spontaneously and instantly sank through the ice.
Rest assured Ice Racing with the



Boston BMW CCA is nothing like that. Not even close! When you approach the turn-off from the main road, and you see the orange cone (with the roundel) and realize it's pointing you onto a lake... well... Then you usually spot other BMWs already on the lake, and you can leave the shore and go for it. Oftentimes, the ice feels remarkably


like smooth pavement... until you hit the brakes and realize that this is pretty tricky. Then, as you get closer to the designated course, you see dozens of cars parked together, just like at an autocross. In fact, you may see cars that are much nicer than yours, and that is when you

realize you have nothing to worry about. Certainly falling through is no longer at the top of your list of worries...

Except this year. The mild winter caused havoc on Newfound Lake. The SCCA Ice Racers in Massachusetts cancelled their only event, and short of driving to Canada, it looked as though Garageboy might not get to compete in any ice racing this winter! Newfound Lake, at 4100 acres, started to freeze, but not enough of the surface of the lake fully froze. After a brief warm spell, the surface turned back to water. Usually, if the lake "catches", meaning the whole surface freezes, the ice below it develops more quickly. As long as it doesn't snow a tremendous amount during that freezing process, and it

remains cold, as much as an inch per day of ice can develop in most parts of the lake. Twelve inches is the minimum amount that must be there for an event to be held. How do we know this? Is it some mystical, ancient secret of the White Mountains that is only shared amongst local New Hampshire residents? Well, no, actually, we have a drill that we use to measure the thickness, and it bottoms out at about 16 inches. Newfound

Lake was not happening for us. Fortunately, due to the resourcefulness of the event organizers, a smaller lake (346 acres) was discovered only 20 miles north of Newfound Lake, and at a much higher elevation. Apparently, this combination of size, latitude and altitude ensured that we had a reliable 18 inches of ice for the entire season! The 2002





Ice Racing Season commenced on February 10th for the first time near Rumney, New Hampshire on Stinson Lake.

The events are run for the Boston Chapter almost entirely by the Jackson Family, a warm, generous group

of car-nuts that have lived on Newfound Lake for longer than anyone can remember. They are affectionately known as The Icemen, despite the fact that the whole family, men and women alike, participate rather competitively in a myriad of silver BMWs and other nearly German vehicles. Garageboy has had the good fortune to become friends with the Jacksons, although some New York Chapter members believe that this friendship is based on a rumor

that Garageboy is required by law to bring New York bagels whenever he visits the Granite State. Legend has it that this law was enacted in exchange for leniency on one of Garageboy's triple-digit speeding violations.

Technical Inspections are fairly innocent. Helmets are not required, but they are not discouraged either. You line up at the start line just like at an autocross, and the timing equipment is all electronic, maintaining accuracy and fairness. When you reach the starting line, you look out over a sea of orange cones and hope that you remember where the course is. Sometimes, when there is snow on the lake, it is necessary to plow the path. It is much easier to follow the course when it has been plowed. However, plowing creates snow banks, which are a doubleedged sword. They can be used for good, like steering the car through a fast turn. Or they can be used for evil, like when you lose control and go off course and stuff your car into a snowbank. The only damage you might do is to your ego.

Cars are classified as rear-wheel, front-wheel.

or all-wheel drive. And then the subclassifications are based on your tires. Tires are very important. Since most participants are from the surrounding states, many entrants use snow tires. In order to be competitive, you cannot run on summer or all-season tires. Some competitors

have started to run ice tires, as these are becoming more popular. For those of us that run snows all winter long, ice tires are not very practical. In areas like New York City, they'll spend 95% of their lives on dry pavement and wear out in one season. The best part of ice racing is that you can do all the things you used to fantasize about doing at Bridgehampton, except without the

threat of impending death. Wanna do a four-wheel drift on the back of the course? No problem! If you make a mistake, you might hit a cone and slide mercilessly out of control... into oblivion. But you won't scratch your car, and you won't hurt yourself!

Sometimes, finishes are

impressive. It's always entertaining to see someone slide through the finish gate sideways or even backwards. Ice Racers are masters of improvisation. I've seen drivers spin out, and to keep their momentum, they finish half their run in reverse. Most racers realize that if their run is already ruined, they might as well show offwith a spectacular finish.

Conditions can change dramatically as well. This can occur from event to event, or even from morning to afternoon! Unlike an autocross, where the conditions are likely to stay the same for the duration of an event, the surface of the lake is guaranteed to change over the course of a day, based on temperature, wind, sunlight, and precipitation.

New scoring rules were put into effect this year that has compensated for the changing conditions and made for more exciting results. The Jacksons are competitive. No matter what class they run in, they want to win. And they all want to beat each other. It has taken me nearly a decade to understand their strategies, and I still have much to learn. I'm still learning how they use the changing conditions to their ad-

vantage. I've successfully learned how to compete with the right tires, but there are still many secrets to be unearthed. This year, I did better than any previous years, and for the first time, my Eta-Power car beat all the M cars. And now that we have a consistent venue for the future at Stinson Lake, I'll come back next year and try again for more FTDs.
