Ith Spring 2013 just around the corner, I start to think about the upcoming racing season and getting my M3 ready for another year of autocross and DE's. Time to change the fluids, replace the worn out brake pads, and make sure all the important nuts and bolts are tight.

For me, a big part of the fun of autocross and DE's is fixing, maintaining, and upgrading the car with my friends. In addition to being a lot of fun, knowing how to work on your own car has

several advantages. One is that it saves money. Being able to do basic maintenance and repairs, like changing your oil or replacing your brakes, can save hundreds of dollars. Second, if you break down, it really helps to understand how cars work and how to do some basic repairs. It's a lot better to be able to quickly change a tire yourself or to get yourself jump started in 10 to 15 minutes than to waste one to two hours waiting for AAA to show up.

Another benefit of having a good understanding of car systems is to protect yourself from being ripped off. Although most repair shops are honest, knowing that your suspension doesn't have to be taken apart to change your brake rotors can help you avoid large, unnecessary repair bills.

For anyone who owns a BMW, or for that matter any car, I strongly suggest that you learn the basics of car repair even if you don't intend to do any of it on your own.

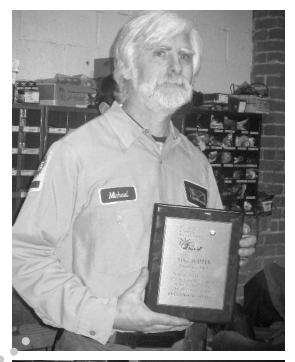
Every year we are treated to some truly unique cars being worked on at the shop and this year was no exception, with three notable "entries": A pair of 5 Series wagons, one inflicted with Hurricane Sandy water damage, sporting an M5 motor transplant and the second with a V12 motor transplant. As our featured speaker, Mike Shiffer gave an impressive talk on the effects of salt water damage on a car and remedial steps that may save the vehicle's drive train. He also spent a great deal of time going over structural enhancements and fabrication steps that were necessary for engine transplants. Initiatives not for the faint of heart!

This year's event was augmented with a presentation by **Joseph DeLeon** from X-Treme Vehicle Coating Inc. Joe did an excellent job demonstrating the installation of clear vinyl coating on a car to protect the paint from chips and scratches. This was followed by a lively discussion on the different methodologies for applying these coatings and on their pros and cons. **Teresa Rodriquez** from Trezori.com was also with us, showing personal products for both men and women offered by her company.

Since our Annual Holiday Party was canceled due to the "wrath of Hurricane Sandy", the 2012 Autocross Awards ceremony was held at this year's Beach Party. Many of the award recipients were on hand to receive their trophies, and for anyone who was unable to attend, the trophies will be available at our first Autocross event in 2013.

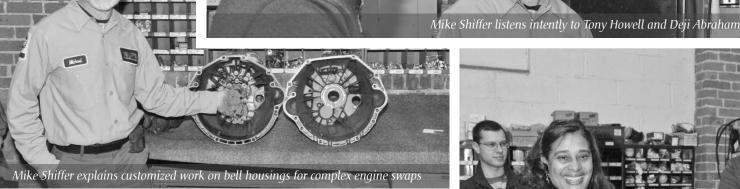

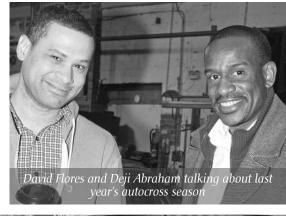

## 2013 New York International Auto Show Preview

On Saturday March 30 2013, I plan to be at the Jacob Javits Center hearing all about BMW's latest offerings, as well as their plans for the future. If you would like to join me, just go to the Chapter website nybmwcca.com for instructions on how to attend.

Our inside guide to early car show presentations for so many years, Larry Koch, has retired from BMW USA. I am looking forward to hearing from our new hosts, Mattew Russell and Thomas Plucinsky, who will be taking over Larry's responsibilities.

While I cannot say for sure what will be on display, I do expect to see one or two surprises (hopefully something from the new 4 Series lineup). And I will have a few questions to ask regarding the 320i and 328i, something entirely new for the US market. These two models have the same engine, but different horsepower and torque specs. Unlike the 335i and the 328i of three years ago, where the 335i had the power advantage via the twin turbo, the 320i and 328i for the 2013 model year appear to have identical power plants. We will have to see how the 3 Series representative explains this one.

With the already announced upcoming arrival of the BMW 4 series, we can expect to see a two-door coupe and a four-door coupe that might look like an act of cannibalism on 3 Series sales (BMW's bread and butter). But take a step back and look at the big picture; unlike the 6 Series Gran Coupe, when BMW was late to the four-door, low roof line party à la Mercedes Benz CL class and Audi A7, they now seem to be on time, if not ahead of the curve. Superbowl Sunday saw Mercedes announce the September 2013 arrival of the new Benz CLA class, which seems ready to compete directly against the new 4 Series lineup. Initially, the only sales competition the 4 Series will see will be from the CLA Benz's. Unless the folks from Audi have an S5 four-door coupe in the pipeline, the BMW camp will be one of the first at the small four-door coupe party (sorry, the Volkswagen CC is just not in this class of rear wheel drive autobahn cruisers). And getting there early does matter, as witnessed by the Benz CLS arriving to create the segment, then watching all the followers, à la Audi S7 and last but not least BMW with their Gran Coupe.

With the X6, BMW introduced a model that was called by myself and other journalists, enthusiasts and petrol heads as the answer to a question nobody asked; however, BMW created a niche market for themselves and has watched yearly sales increase, only to witness the Infinity FX and Acura ZDX follow in the new segment, with no option from Mercedes and Audi who are both still hinting at some sort of competitive response in the near future. Or maybe we will see another marque following BMW's lead into the X6 four-passenger SAV market, or even a fourth competitor in the four-door coupe market from Lexus or Infinity on display at the New York International Autoshow. We shall see on Saturday morning, March 30th. Looking forward to seeing and hearing questions from many New York Chapter BMW CCA members at the car show.

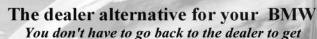

## Tech Talk with Mike Shiffer

On Friday I got a call from a customer with a 2006 325i. He was concerned because his engine's electric fan was running for an unusually long time. We discussed the possibility of a fan controller having gone bad, or some other wiring issue. He decided he would bring in the car next week, as he needed it to get to the airport on Saturday. I started to tell him that was fine, but then I remembered

something. I asked him to drop off the car immediately and not to try to make it to the airport. The fan was most likely compensating for a problem with his electric water pump, as it is programmed to do. Even though the car had not been overheating, he agreed to drop it off right away. On his way to my shop the car started running hot. Turned out the water pump had stopped running, maybe a mile from my shop. Stored codes indicated it had been slowing down for a while, and finally decided to quit.

The same day we fixed a couple of oil leaks on a 6-cylinder X5, which included replacing the valve cover gasket. The owner came in Saturday to pick it up. He drove halfway up the block, stopped and brought it back. "The Service Engine light is on", he announced. Odd. It hadn't been on Friday when we test drove it. I got a scan tool and pulled codes: Secondary air injection low flow, banks 1 & 2. The only part of this system that is likely to be affected by the work we did is a plastic pipe that runs from the secondary air valve along side the valve cover, around the back and up the other side of the engine where it plumbs into a vacuum solenoid switch with a short length of rubber hose. If the pipe or hose is leaking or pinched off, low flow codes will be stored. Since the pipe is easily caught between the valve cover and the cylinder head when changing the VC gasket, I looked at it first. (Since we know of this possibility, we double-check -- literally, two different guys check -to make sure the pipe is free.) Unsurprisingly, the pipe wasn't pinched on this car, but in feeling along the pipe I found the problem. The small hose that connects the pipe to the vacuum switch had torn: it was dried out and brittle. It had obviously cracked when we moved the pipe while replacing the valve cover gasket. I replaced the hose with a new piece, cleared the codes and sent the car on its way, certain this had fixed the problem.

A third BMW had an inoperative remote trunk release. The dashboard display showed the trunk lid open even when it was closed and latched. There is a switch in the latch itself that is supposed to close when the lid is secure. It clearly wasn't working. I replaced the latch and all seemed well. The owner picked up the car, only to see the trunk open icon pop up as he was leaving. While he waited, I removed the new latch and noticed corrosion in the wiring plug. I checked the old latch and saw that one of the pins on its plug was badly corroded. Confident that the problem was a bad connection in the plug (and relieved I had replaced the right part: the pin on the old latch was too damaged to fix), I cleaned the plug sockets and plugged in the latch without installing it in the trunk lid. Didn't work: the warning light was still on. I confirmed the wiring was now sound, and that I would need to look further for the

problem. It was late, so the customer left the car for me to work on the next day. I put the latch back into place so I could close the trunk before going home and found it now worked perfectly. I figured there was a second switch in a different part of the trunk lid that detects whether the lid is up or down, so as long as the lid is up the switch in the latch is ignored. I had been closing the latch with the trunk open, so the warning light never went off. Clever BMW engineers, I thought. They realize the latch could be closed with the lid still open so they fit another switch that closes when the lid is more than a few degrees from horizontal.

I was wrong. There is no second switch, which I found out a couple of weeks later when the car came back for the same problem. What it turned out to be was a broken ground wire in the harness where it flexes near the right trunk hinge. It was grounding some of the time, then breaking contact. When it was grounded the dash warning light stayed off, and when it wasn't the light came on. I found this the old-fashioned way: wiggling the harness and watching the trunk light, which was wired into the circuit as well.

Modern cars are intelligent. This adds a layer to diagnosing problems. In each of these examples, the cause of the problem was not related to the symptom in a straightforward way. In the first case, the fan's abnormal running was the only symptom, but it was not the problem. It was a planned response to the actual problem: water pump inefficiency and eventual failure.

The second car's issue was more straightforward. The customer picked up the car after it had been parked most of the day. The secondary air pump ran when the car was started, but there was no air flow. The valve, which should have been opened by vacuum applied to the pipe that runs behind the head, stayed closed because of the broken hose. The condition that made the check engine light come on was easily found by reading the diagnostic code. The reason the light didn't turn on when the car was road tested is that by design, the air pump doesn't run every time the car is started. Its function is to reduce emissions during warm-up, and to speed the heating of the catalytic converters. When the car is already warm, the pump doesn't run. Until it does run it isn't checked by the engine management's self-diagnostic program, and if it isn't checked it won't set any codes. When I road-tested the car, it was still warm enough not to call for the air pump.

In the third case, I outsmarted myself by thinking the car had a second switch when the "switch" turned out to be a broken wire that would make contact when it felt like it.

This is what auto repair looks like these days. To diagnose problems, I need to take into account the strategies BMW uses to compensate for component failure, the meaning and likely causes of "Check Engine" light codes, and remember that even today, complicated-looking problems may have simple causes.
